**OVERVIEW** - Nav's ability to motivate people to try music and train any group of people means he successfully delivers workshops in various contexts including executive management training courses, wellbeing support groups and in prisons. SCHOOL OUTREACH/TEACHER TRAINING - Nav's youth choir has been partnered with the BBC Singers creating mentoring and training pathways for disenfranchised youth in East London and since 2021 has been privileged to work extensively with world famous 'Tenebrae' leading their schools outreach work. Additional projects with London Youth Choir and Spitalfields Music mean that Nav is busily developing outreach work across London on an ongoing basis. Nav is proud and most excited that through MDBrunch and these various projects he is able to deliver teacher training to help skill up music education both here in the UK across London, Suffolk, Norfolk and Essex but now also across Asia.
